Catch –Up Premium funding £17,000

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provides state-funded schools with additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard (i.e. a scaled score of 100) in reading or Maths in their national curriculum tests (SATs) at the end of Key Stage 2. Secondary schools are expected to identify those pupils from their Year 7 intake who are entitled to this support and use the catch-up premium to fund programmes and approaches that will help these pupils catch up with their peers. Examples of such programmes might be individual or small group tuition or summer schools. The government allocated a maximum of £500 in respect of each student who was at a maintained school in Year 6 who had not attained the national floor standard in reading and/or mathematics. That standard has been set at a score of 100.

A percentage of the catch-up premium at The de Ferrers Academy was used to fund the provision of a bespoke curriculum for pupils who did not achieve expected standard at KS2. Target students were taught together in the `Progress Group` which had a strong focus on literacy and numeracy. The Year 7 Catch-Up funding has also been used by the Academy to provide literacy and numeracy catch-up support for Year 7 students. This enabled those students ***that did not achieve the floor standard score of 100 in reading and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2*** to be given the opportunity to catch up as quickly as possible. The majority of this was done by the Academy delivering additional tuition or intensive support in small groups, giving students valuable support to bring them up to speed so that they are more likely to succeed. Other initiatives are outlined below

Numeracy Strategies 2018-2019

- Meet with DLs to discuss numeracy strategies in their subjects (ongoing) Equip form tutors with the numeracy challenge (ongoing)
- Update the numeracy board in the LC
- Make numeracy board interactive and allow progress to be made by pupils through independent learning
